Writing Emphasis: 2 courses required for all majors except Economics which is a writing in the major program.

All students must also complete two writing emphasis courses at the 200 level or above, one of which must be at the 300 level or above.

One course must be in the major (not core). See the class timetable or schedule planner for information on offerings each semester (not a set list).

REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION

- Fulfill the University's General Education Program requirements.
- Earn a minimum of 120 semester credits with at least a 2.00 cumulative grade point average (GPA) Note that GPA requirements for some programs may be higher than 2.00.
- At least 40 credits must be earned in 300 and 400 (upper division) numbered courses.
- Earn a minimum of 30 credits at UWL.
- Complete CBA core requirements, and department major and minor requirements with at least a 2.00 cumulative grade point average in the business core and the business major (Accountancy requires minimum 2.50 major gpa).
- Complete at least 50% of the business course requirements (core and major) at UWL.
- File a completed "Application for Graduation" form in WINGS.

Policies, prerequisites, and course descriptions are stated in the University Catalog. This guide should be used with the catalog to ensure general education, CBA core, major/minor, and graduation requirements are met.
