Further, after you have submitted the disclosure statement, while your application is being considered or while you are a student in a program or if circumstances occur that would change any responses, you must inform the Clinical Laboratory Science Program of the changed responses.

An affirmative response to an item does not necessarily mean that you will be denied admission. You will be contacted to explain the circumstances leading to the affirmative response. In addition, the Clinical Laboratory Science Program may request further information from the appropriate sources. If necessary, your consent to obtain this information will be acquired.
