On behalf of Emplify Health, I am writing to express support for the UW-La Crosse Prairie Springs Science Center Completion and Cowley Hall Demolition Project. Prairie Springs would complete the university's new home for Biology, Chemistry, Geography, Mathematics, and Physics. For your reference, Bellin and Gundersen includes more than 14,000 dedicated care providers at 11 hospitals and more than 100 clinic locations serving patients, their families and communities in Wisconsin, Minnesota, Iowa, and Upper Michigan.

As a leading local and regional healthcare provider, we recognize the value of partnerships with organizations like UW-La Crosse to achieve better health and well-being for everyone. Educating and empowering the healthcare workforce of the future and strengthening the workforce pipeline are key focus areas for our organization. The strong Physician Assistant program at UW-L and medical research happening at the nationally recognized Health Science Consortium on the UW-L campus are two examples of our collaborative, long-term commitment to these efforts. A completed Prairie Springs Science Center with modern research equipment and supplies benefit UW-L, Emplify Health and the community through future research agreements and partnerships.
