

FINANCIAL AID HOW TO'S

Each year, the UW-La Crosse Financial Aid Office awards \$60 million in aid in the form of loans, state and federal grants, and student employment. Approximately 70% of UWL students receive financial aid each year.

Students apply for financial aid by completing the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) online at studentaid.gov.

NEW FRESHMAN TIMELINE

FEBRUARY:

- Submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at studentaid.gov. If you are submitting a FAFSA, please be sure the Admissions Office has your Social Security number on file.

MARCH:

- Register for required placement tests.
 - Registration is scheduled to open on March 15, 2025.
 - Take the exam before May 15, 2025.
 - See enclosed information for details.
- Log into WINGS to see your financial aid package.

APRIL:

- Sign up for START. Instructions will be mailed to your home address in the spring if you have paid the \$100 enrollment deposit.
- Apply for tuition reciprocity if you are from Minnesota. Visit www.ohe.state.mn.us/ssl/reciprocity2024/ to apply.

JUNE:

- Attend START.
- Receive hall and roommate assignments.
- Have an official final high school transcript sent to the Admissions Office.
- If you have earned college credit while in high school, request all final college transcripts to be sent to the Admissions Office.

JULY-AUGUST:

- Look for communication regarding New Student Orientation and Welcome Week.

SEPTEMBER:

- Move into your residence hall.
- Start classes on Sept. 2.

OCTOBER:

- Participate in Family Weekend Oct. 10-12.

1. REGISTER FOR THE WISCONSIN PLACEMENT TESTS *(Information Enclosed)*

The Wisconsin Placement Tests are required of all students planning to attend UWL. Please carefully read the enclosed information and register for your test as soon as possible. Students are strongly encouraged to take the exam by May 15, 2025 so that your scores are available when you register for classes.

2. PAY YOUR DEPOSITS FOR FALL 2025

We hope that you are enjoying your senior year...it's going by quickly and we are already looking forward to seeing you in June! If you have not already done so, you need to make your \$100 enrollment deposit, complete the on-campus housing application and pay the \$150 housing deposit.

You should submit the enrollment deposit using your WINGS Student Center (see the Next Steps booklet that was included with your admission letter). After your enrollment deposit is received, you will be mailed on-campus housing information and instructions. Follow the instructions to complete your housing application.

Only students who have submitted the enrollment deposit will be sent START materials in the spring. Both deposits are refundable until May 1, 2025.

3. DO YOU KNOW YOUR NETID/WINGS PASSWORD?

If you have not logged into your WINGS Student Center, please do so very soon. This is where you will complete important steps like pay deposits, submit the housing application and register for START. You can use the WINGS username/password recovery available at uwlax.edu/info/password-reset if you have misplaced or cannot remember login information.

WHY UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH?

Students and families are invited to attend START! You will spend one day on campus selecting classes, learning more about the UWL experience and meeting other new freshmen. We can only accommodate a specific number of students for each date in order to provide adequate advising for all students.



GET A HEAD START ON YOUR COLLEGE EXPERIENCE

FASTTRACK:

FastTrack is a summer mathematics bridge program for students placed into MTH 051. The program is a 6-week online, self-paced program with the goal of sharpening algebra skills in order to place into a higher mathematics class.

COLLEGE CREDIT TRANSFER

Future UW-La Crosse students can earn college credit in high school through a number of programs.

1. Advanced Placement (AP): Students earning a score of "3" or higher on the AP Exams are eligible for credit.
2. International Baccalaureate (IB): Students earning a "4" or higher on IB-Higher Level exams are eligible for credit.
3. College Level Examination Program (CLEP) credits are also available.

Students can also earn college credit from a college or university during high school. All final college transcripts should be sent to the Admissions Office prior to START. If transcripts are not received, students will not be eligible to register for their second semester of classes.



HOUSING APPLICATION

The housing application gives you the opportunity to provide information that will shape your on-campus experience. You are encouraged to complete the housing application as soon as possible. If you would like to change your preferences or update information, you can return to the housing application after initially completing it.

- Select or change your top three hall assignment preferences.
- Pick a meal plan.

After you have completed the housing application, you will be able to access the online roommate selection process. You can connect with other UWL students who have applied for housing. Once you have found your roommate, you can form a roommate group, which will allow you to be assigned to a residence hall room together.

- Selecting a roommate is optional. If you do not select a roommate you will be assigned one.
- Review recommended roommates for you based upon preferences provided in the housing application.
- Search for roommates based on responses to specific profile questions.
- Already know who you want to live with? You can also search for roommates by first and last name.

STUDENT HEALTH CENTER

The UWL Student Health Center (SHC) is a comprehensive outpatient clinic promoting good health, emphasizing patient education and encouraging preventive care to help ensure academic success for all students.

Services available include primary care, mental health, minor injuries, lab, immunizations, female and male reproductive care (including STI testing and contraception), psychiatry, allergy shots and physical therapy.

The SHC staff includes board-certified physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, physical therapists, nurses, medical technologists, medical assistants and office personnel who are experienced in working with the health care needs of college students.

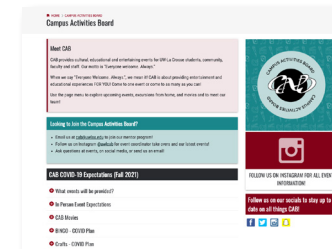

STUDENT ID

CAB (CAMPUS ACTIVITIES BOARD)

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SERVICES FOR STUDENTS

Microsoft Office 365 provides essential productivity tools that significantly enhance the academic experience on campus. The Information Technology Services (ITS) department is committed to maintaining a safe and secure digital environment for all students, faculty and staff. It is crucial for users to exercise caution when interacting with links, particularly on mobile devices; if there is any doubt regarding the legitimacy of an email, it is best not to click it. It is vital to keep antivirus software up to date in order to protect your sensitive information. Students are strongly encouraged to stay informed by reading all official communications from ITS and all university departments.

ITS works diligently to keep students, faculty and staff safe, informed and secure in the data environment. Be careful when clicking on links, especially on smartphones. If you are not certain of the validity of an email or web link, do not click on it. On your computer, simply hovering your mouse over the FROM: field will reveal if the message is coming from a valid source. Finally, make sure your virus protection software is up to date. Students are encouraged to read all official ITS emails from its@uwla.edu. Follow ITS on Facebook at "UWL ITS" and on X at "@EagleHelpDesk".

To protect yourself against phishing attacks, malware, viruses and ransomware, please follow these steps:

1. ITS will never request your password via email or phone call.
2. If you are uncertain whether an email is a phishing attempt or a legitimate communication, DO NOT click on any links. Forward it to the Eagle Help Desk and we can assist with the email.
3. Make it a priority to review your UWL emails regularly. Verify that important messages from ITS and other university departments are not being redirected to your Junk or Clutter folders.
4. If you get a new phone, be sure to uninstall Okta from your old phone and set it up on your new phone.
5. If you still have questions, contact the Eagle Help desk by walking in, calling 608.785.8744, or emailing helpdesk@uwla.edu.

PARKING ON CAMPUS

Parking in any university lot requires a parking permit or use of the Passport mobile app.

All new students will learn about the online process for purchasing a parking permit at START this summer. Parking Services sells a limited number of parking permits based on seniority. Students are encouraged to consider their transportation needs to determine if bringing a vehicle to campus is necessary.

Resident (living on campus) parking permits are estimated to be \$173 per semester or \$250 for two semesters. Commuter (living off campus) parking permits are estimated to be \$140 per semester or \$198 for two semesters.



U-PASS BUS SYSTEM

The U-Pass provides unlimited bus service on any current La Crosse Municipal Transit Utility (MTU) route in La Crosse or Onalaska for no cost when students show their UWL student ID.

The U-Pass/Safe Ride also has no cost. It runs from 10:30 p.m. to 3 a.m. Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays. The Safe Ride runs between on and off campus housing areas and downtown La Crosse every 15 minutes.

Regional Bus Service

UWL is a stop for Jefferson Bus Lines, Coach USA and the Scenic Mississippi Regional Transit (S.M.R.T.).
