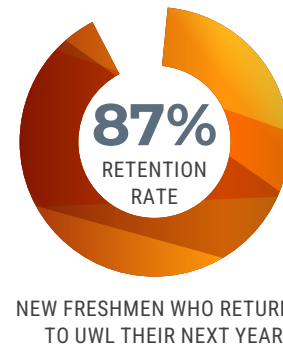



UWL offers an elite, NCAA Division III program that has earned 75 national championship titles in women's and men's sports. Our students are not only top competitors on the track, mat, floor and field, they also consistently perform in the classroom with the highest average GPA in the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC).

At UWL, we offer facilities and fans that can't be beat. Roger Harring Stadium at Veterans Memorial Field Sports Complex seats 6,250 raucous football fans for every home game. To keep pace with the growth of the university's athletic and recreational programs, a new student fieldhouse opened in 2023, including a 200-meter competition indoor track with an all sport surface infield and space for over 1,500 spectators, as well as a walking/jogging track, team locker rooms and more.

One of the most active buildings on campus is Mitchell Hall, home to all things exercise and sport-related, including health education, camps and clinics, intercollegiate athletics and much more. The gymnasium seats 2,880 spectators and the pool remains one of the fastest racing pools in the conference.

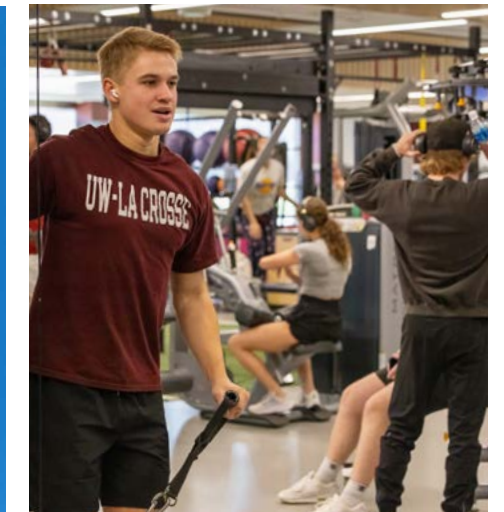

WHAT WE CONSIDER

 - Essays
 - Letters of recommendation (optional)
- Due to the competitive nature of admission to UWL, all applicants receive a comprehensive review.

- Apply online using the UW System application for undergraduate admission at apply.wisconsin.edu and submit your nonrefundable application fee, high school transcript and ACT/SAT scores (optional).
- If admitted, submit your \$100 enrollment deposit (refundable until May 1), to secure your place in the freshman class and to become eligible to sign up for on-campus housing. Deposits are paid through the WINGS Student Center at uwlax.edu/wings. Enrollment deposits submitted after May 1 will be accepted on a space-available basis.
- Visit the admitted student webpage at uwlax.edu/admissions/next-steps/admitted-new-freshman/ to guide you through enrollment.
- You will receive information about on-campus housing after submitting your \$100 enrollment deposit.
- Apply for need-based financial aid using the FAFSA (studentaid.gov). Submitted income tax records are needed to complete this form. Priority date is February 1; however, applications are considered throughout the year.
- Apply for scholarships through the UWL Foundation (uwlax.academicworks.com) by February 1.
- Take the University of Wisconsin Placement Tests in English, mathematics and an optional foreign language. Tests are offered beginning in March. Test registration information will be mailed in early February.
- If you are a resident of Minnesota, file for tuition reciprocity online after April 1 at ohe.state.mn.us.
- Attend START (Student Advising, Registration, and Transition). Information will be mailed in April to all students who have submitted the \$100 enrollment deposit. START takes place in June.
- After graduation, have your high school send an official final transcript to our Admissions Office. Also send Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate scores. If you have college credits, request that an official transcript be sent from the crediting institution. Be sure to send all transcripts before START!
- Watch your UWL email in June for housing and roommate assignments. Pack for UWL.
- Move in over Labor Day weekend and explore New Student Orientation and Welcome Week activities.

TRANSFER ADMISSION GUIDELINES

We welcome applicants who wish to transfer from other colleges, universities or two-year institutions. All applicants for admission will receive a comprehensive review. Academic preparation is the primary criteria used in the admissions review process. We also consider extracurricular involvement, demonstrated leadership, essay, and recommendations.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Students with at least a 2.25 cumulative grade point average in transferable credits will be stronger candidates for admission.
- Students transferring from a UW System Campus with a cumulative grade point average of 2.00 and 18 transferable credits are encouraged to apply.
- Students with a cumulative grade point average between 2.00 and 2.24 in transferable credits will be considered for admission if space is available.
- Students who were not admissible as new freshmen must have earned at least 18 transferable credits to be considered for transfer admission.

Please note: Admission to UWL does not ensure admission to specific degree programs. All transfer students must meet the same criteria as continuing students for admission to specific majors or programs.

TRANSFER ADMISSION PROCESS

- Applications for Spring 2025 are accepted beginning April 1, 2024. Applications for Fall 2025 are accepted beginning August 1, 2024. Applications are considered on a rolling basis. When we have reached a maximum number of transfer students per term, admission will close.
- Apply online using the UW System application for undergraduate admission at apply.wisconsin.edu and submit your nonrefundable application fee and appropriate supporting documents: high school transcript, official college transcript(s) and a list of current courses in progress.
- If admitted, the Admissions Office will evaluate the courses you completed to determine your classification as a freshman, sophomore, junior or senior.
- Once complete, you will receive an email confirming that you can review your transfer credit report online using the WINGS Student Center.
- Apply for need-based financial aid using the FAFSA (studentaid.gov).
- UW System Placement Testing may be required to enroll in English, mathematics and foreign language.
- Attend Transfer Resources and Engagement Kickoff (TREK). Invitations will be sent to all admitted students.
- If you are a resident of Minnesota, file for tuition reciprocity online after April 1 at ohe.state.mn.us

TRANSFER CREDIT

Transfer Wisconsin is the result of a collaborative effort by the UW System and the Wisconsin Technical College System to help students transfer between all public, post-secondary institutions in the State of Wisconsin. The Transfer Wisconsin website offers tools and a wealth of resources for you to take the next steps toward enrolling at UWL.

Transferology is a nationwide network designed to help students answer the question of how their courses will transfer. FINANCIAL AID

We are committed to providing the information you need to pursue your goals and make the most of all available financial resources. Using the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid), the Financial Aid Office determines each student's eligibility for need-based financial aid from federal, state and institutional sources. If applying for financial aid, the FAFSA application is available online at studentaid.gov.

You will need your completed federal income tax information to complete the FAFSA. The priority date is February 1 for consideration of all types of need-based aid; however, applications are accepted throughout the academic year.

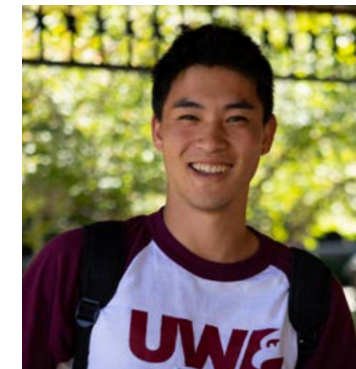

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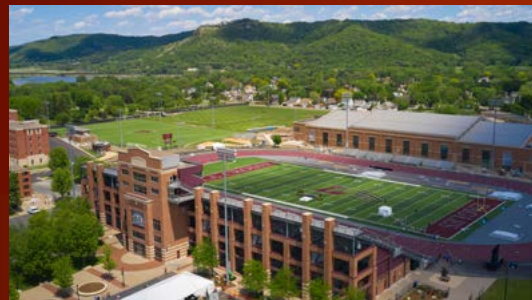
