## BUILDING YOUR SCHEDULE

You already have a partial schedule. Today you will register for additional courses to complete your fall schedule. To be a full-time student, you need at least 12 credits; we do not recommend more than 16 in your first semester. Most of the courses you register for today will be GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS. These are courses outside of your major that give you knowledge and skills essential for independent learning and critical thinking - e.g. life after college.
This document includes a list of general education categories and courses. With the help of an advisor, you will select general education courses to complete your fall schedule.

## FERPA

## THINGS TO CONSIDER

Make sure to tell your advisor about any potential college credit you may have. Remember to have the scores and/or final transcript with grades sent to UWL as soon as it is available.

DO YOU PLAN TO BE INVOLVED IN BAND OR MUSIC ENSEMBLES? Refer to the flier in your folder to see course numbers for music ensembles. You should register for any music groups for which you intend to audition.

WILL YOU PLAY AN ATHLETIC SPORT AT UWL? Talk with your coach and advisor about scheduling around practice times. You may need to register for the appropriate section of ESS 100 for team conditioning.

HAVE YOU CHANGED YOUR MIND ABOUT YOUR MAJOR? Attend the advising session of your NEW major. There will be an opportunity to change your major today.

SCHEDULE PLANNER: Tool located in WINGS to help fit classes together into a schedule. You may select the best arrangement of class times and then register
SHOPPING CART: Add courses to your shopping cart to register. ADD, DROP, AND SWAP: Use SWAP when replacing one course with another.

MY PLANNER: Tool for mapping out your entire academic career; advisor may view your plan.
PREREQUISITE: A course or other requirement that must be completed before moving onto the next course. The prerequisite will be listed under "Enrollment Requirement" in the schedule when viewing the class details.
